ABOUT THE PIECE:

This piece was written for the fourth grade band, chorus, and orchestra of Collegiate School in Richmond, Virginia. I am grateful to all of the students of the Collegiate Lower School for their suggestions and advice for this piece; I have used many of their ideas about melodies, rhythms, themes, sounds, and form while writing this work.

Special thanks also to Lois Jecklin for her initiative and support for this project, and to the Collegiate Lower School music teachers, Beth Tracy and Patsy Hallett, for their dedication and enthusiasm for the project.

The text of the piece is adapted from the poem which closes Rudyard Kipling's *The Second Jungle Book*, and is in the public domain.

PERFORMANCE NOTES:

- Any performance of this piece must include the choral, piano, and percussion parts; use of the band and/or string orchestra is optional.
- The specific percussion instruments are merely suggestions, and may be replaced by other related instruments, or even by household objects. It is preferable to have one player per part for the percussion, but if students have trouble sustaining their rhythms, it may help to double or even triple each part.
- The tied whole notes for the rainstick indicate that there should be no pause in the sound. Before all the "filling" in the stick moves to one end, the player should already begin turning the stick on its other side.
- The flutes and saxophones are asked to perform key clicks as fast as possible. Though these are notated as a series of tied whole notes, do not be deceived! The actual effect is to depress as many different keys on the instrument as quickly as possible to create an effect similar to the rainstick.
- The "yowl" indication is merely a suggestion for an animal sound. The performers may make other animal sounds if they prefer. They may all make the same sound or they may all make different sounds. They may make a single sound in unison or many sounds with staggered entrances. Experiment and see what you like best! But no matter what, the "yowl" gesture cannot last beyond the single indicated measure.
